Únicamente se podrá tramitar la autorización de estancia de larga duración, y por tanto expedir el correspondiente visado, a familiares de personas que cursen en España estudios superiores (artículo 52.1.a) o formación sanitaria especializada (artículo 58).

La solicitud de visado del estudiante y la de su familiar no pueden tramitarse simultáneamente, puesto que de acuerdo al artículo 56.3.1º es requisito del visado del familiar a valorar por la oficina de extranjería que el estudiante (reagrupante) sea titular de una autorización de estancia de larga duración por estudios en vigor. Long-term residence permits, and therefore the corresponding visas, may only be issued to family members of individuals pursuing higher education (Article 52.1.a) or specialized healthcare training (Article 58) in Spain.

The student's visa application and that of their family member cannot be processed simultaneously, since, according to Article 56.3.1, a visa application for the family member, to be assessed by the Immigration Office, requires that the student (the sponsor) hold a valid long-term residence permit for study purposes.

Further to your application for a **Family of student (stay more than 6 months)**, we list below the documents that have to be submitted.

		*National visa application form Each applicant must complete and sign a visa application, filling in each of its sections. If the applicant is a minor, both of their parents or a duly accredited representative must sign the application.
		Valid, unexpired passport. Original and a photocopy of the page or pages of the passport that contain biometric data. The passport must be valid at least for 1 year and contain two blank pages. Passports issued more than 10 years ago will not be accepted.
		*Legalized and translated Shenاسnameh: (Spanish translation for the last 6 month). For all the family members. If anyone has been born in Spain, he/she should provide it.
		*Photograph: A recent, 3.5*4.5,(for the last 3 month) color photograph,, taken against a light background, facing forward, without dark or reflective glasses, or any garments concealing the oval of the face.
		*Proof of financial means: Original and a copy of the documents proving that the applicant (or their legal representative or the family member supporting them) has sufficient financial means to cover the expenses of the student's stay and return, as well as the stay and return of the family members accompanying them. The minimum required amount is equivalent to 100% of Spain's Public Multiple Effects Income Indicator (IPREM). To this amount must be added 75% of the IPREM for the first family member and 50% of the IPREM for each additional family member. If proof is provided that accommodation for the entire stay has been paid for in advance, this amount will be deducted. Foreign documents must be legalized or apostilled and, where applicable, must be submitted together with an official translation into Spanish
		*Health insurance: Original and a copy of the certificate accrediting the health insurance contracted with an insurance entity authorized to operate in Spain. The insurance policy must cover all the risks insured by Spain's public health system. If the applicant is participating in a volunteer program, in addition to the medical insurance, they must provide a copy of the civil liability insurance policy taken out by the organization.
		*Criminal record check certificate. (for the last 3 month): Applicants of legal age who apply for a visa for a stay of more than 180 days must submit the original and a copy of the criminal record check certificate(s) issued by their country or countries of residence for the past 5 years. Foreign documents must be legalized or apostilled and, where applicable, must be submitted together with an official translation into Spanish.

		*Medical certificate. (for the last 3 month): Applicants requiring a visa for a stay of more than 180 days must submit the original and a copy of a medical certificate accrediting that they do not suffer from any disease that could cause serious repercussions for public health pursuant to the 2005 International Health Regulations. Foreign documents must be legalized or apostilled and, where applicable, must be submitted together with an official translation into Spanish.
		* Photocopy of the Residence Card/ National Visa of the student.
		* Proof of relationship with the student: the certificates proving kinship with the student (marriage certificate, unmarried couple certificate, or birth certificate, as applicable) must be provided. Foreign documents must be legalized or apostilled and, where applicable, must be submitted together with an official translation into Spanish.
		Proof of residence in the consular district (only for non Iranian nationals).
